# Woodlands complex combines concepts

Peel County School Board will pour more than \$15 million into building schools next year, but had to chop \$6,300,000 off the budget and set up priorities.

chairman Grice revealed the building program to Mississauga committee last

The priorities include two new secondary schools and more than \$7 million. Brampton-Bramalea Secondary School will go up at a cost of \$3,935,000. of which the county will pay \$2.655.000. The province kicks in the difference

#### WOODLANDS

Mississauga will get a new \$3.205.000 secondary school with Woodlands S.S. to be built on the east side of Erindale Station Road. county will pay \$2,475,000 towards school.

Applewood Heights Secondary will have 15 class-rooms added to it at a cost of \$1.200,000. Chairman Grice pointed out that despite the opening of Glenforest Secondary in that area. Applewood Heights will hold classes in several portable classrooms this vear.

A \$1 million addition is needed at Clarkson Secondary as well to absorb the students being turned

out by two new senior pubschools in Clarkson. the board decided the addition will have to wait until 1971.

Woodlands Secondary will be part of a secondary-public school complex on Erindale Station Road. The new school is planned to 1180 students it opens in 1971, but allows for expansion to 1500 students in the near future.

The school is intended to offer arts and science programs as well as commercial courses, but a number of folding partitions and adequate open space allows the board to maintain flexibility in courses available at Woodlands.

Both secondary and public school students at the complex will share library cafeteria, gymnasium and guidance facilities in the new school. Administration offices for both schools will be integrated as well.

Mr. Grice pointed out that the school will be put to use 12 months a year, with community activities and semester systems in the future for secondary school students. He said air conditioning is requred in the school.

Every teaching area in the school will be equipped with television receiving facilities as off-air, cable and

Woodlands will have a double gym of approxi-mately 7500 square feet. equipped with a folding door and a single gym of 3600 square feet. The cafeteria will hold 700 students and a staff dining room will seat 50

#### PUBLIC USE

A large group instruc-tion room of 1600 square feet will have folding doors to slice the room into three smaller areas and will be designed for community use. There will be four science laboratories, four geography rooms and one language lab.

The school will have 12 general classrooms, two art rooms, a music and drama room. a vocal music room, two home economic rooms equipped with four kitchen areas, four seminar rooms, three typewriting rooms, one manual and two electric, a commercial practice room, two bookkeeping and accounting rooms and a secretarial laboratory.

Woodlands will be one of the county schools to use a community police officer

Woodlands Junior Public School, the third segment of the Erindale Road complex, missed the priority for Mississauga and will be considered in the 1971 budget with an exof \$630,000. pected cost

PUBLIC SCHOOLS Public Schools to be built in Mississauga next year include Camilla Road Senior Public School, a 20room school to service 465 costing students and

\$925,000 Green Glades Junior Senior Public School will cost \$850,000 and accommodate 515 students. It will be built between Highway 2 and Lake Ontario in Clark-

The board plans to bus the senior students out of that area next year.

Cawthra-Burnhamthorpe Junior Public School will have 422 students and relieve pressure on Silverthorne Public School. It will cost \$630,000 and is

the first school going into the McLaughlin subdivision.

Sheridan Park Junior Public School will have an addition \$330,000 to accommodate 248 students. Grade 6 students will attend Homelands Senior Public School. Three portables and an eightroom addition to Malton Junior Public will cost \$420,000 and will serve development east of Airport Road.

Tomken Road Senior will also have eight rooms added next year as well as the second half of a double portables at a cost of \$400,000.

Present renovations and additions will cost \$300,000 at Balmoral Senior. The additions include a new gymnasium

Total public school construction in Mississauga will cost \$4,305,000 and construction in the of the county will cost \$1,600,000. Public School sites cost \$1,200,000 in the county.

Secondary School construction here will cost \$3,675,000 and \$2,655,000 will be spent in the rest of the county. Cost of Secondary School sites in the county was \$1,500,000.
