

Hunter's time been sent down to the Secretary
of Indian Affairs. All appointments in
the Indian Department in Upper Canada
being in the Civil Government I left them
with you, conceiving the President the
person to approve, whether Genl. Hunter
approved of them in his Military cha-
racter or as Lieut. Governor I cannot say.
The order which I received last Year to
prepare the Requisitions for Presents
Provision and Stationary and also
the Establishment and Temporary list was
from the Military Secretary. The requisitions
handed to you by Mr. Connors & Coffin
were copies of those sent from the different
Posts and returned by the Secretary of
Indian Affairs with the prices carried
out, as I presume will be the case with
those in question. Therefore I conceive nothing
but the President's approval will be necessary
now. The Establishment list of persons,
holding temporary appointments with
the Requisition for Stationary accompanying
the Requisitions which were transmitted
in May last, why they were not returned
for the President's approval with those
sent before him last February.
