In answer to your letter of the 37th ulto I have the honor to state that for many years the Chippewas of the Thames have paid one of their band to be their Clark and Interpreter or as they call it to do their business

They have been invariably appointed at the request of the band Their duties have been to comminceate to the Superintendent, to attend their comucils and Reep a record of the same. and to act as interpreter whenever required.

as far as I am concerned the office is not necessary, as for a Imall renumeration can always obtain the services of ine of the young men to interpret what I may have to day.

Although all the young men speak more or less English but few of those over 30 years of age have any unowledge of it.

The first person who was appointed was adam Fisher, who died, then Ho . Chase was appointed and after him John Henry in april 1858. Henry is a most excellent man in every respect and of Superior information having havelled with his father through all Europe and the United States. all Ourope and the United States.

Ince the system of equal justice to every member of the born d has happily been established, the power and influence of the Chiefs has nearly ceased. Of Lix that held this office in 1855 three have died, one, of the remaining three, two are drinkards and the third ignorant.
