Dear King,-

Our arrangements have been made for the Laurier demonstration on the 8th. I find that you are speaking that night at Ingersoll. We are anxious to have you come to Stratford with Sir Wilfred and you can leave here at 4.30 and be in Ingersoll at 6 P.M.. The committee are anxious to have both ^{Graham} ~~McMahon~~ and you here and have Graham rest and speak in the evening to the working men and Railway men in Stratford. He can leave at 10.15 and be in Windsor the next day at 10.0'clock. The Chief intends to stay in London all night and it is quite immaterial whether he leaves here at 5.25 or 10.15 as his car remains in London over night. Harding received a letter from Scellen. We are anxious to have a good representation from Waterloo to hear the Chief ^{being} and you are advertised as we expected that you would be here.

Kindly think the matter over and let me know by wire. We would also like to have you bring a band from Berlin to help make it one of the greatest events that has ever taken place in Western Ontario.

We are sending bills throughout your riding and no doubt there will be an enormous crowd from Waterloo.

Try and give me a hand. Wire answer.
