

field ploughed and fenced also the remains of a mill that had been partly finished, in connection with which much labor had been expended in creating a dam which had broken away, and that the unfinished mill site then stood a ruin, and that were he asked to estimate Mr Curran's loss he should place it at from \$500.00 to \$600.00.

Mr Dewdney was then requested by letter of the 30<sup>th</sup> of October 1882 to state his opinion on Mr Anderson's view of the matter and what amount should in his opinion be paid Mr Curran for his improvements.

On the 28<sup>th</sup> of November 1882 a letter was received which
