I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 25th ult, returning the cheque for \$56.54 sent you in favour of Miss Irene E. Melson, teacher of the Port Elgin school, for June quarter last, and asking that a new cheque in her favour for \$75 be issued for that quarter.

In reply I log to say that Miss Nelson returns for the year ended June 30, last, show that her school was kept open as follows:-

Sept. Tr. 38 days, closed 37, out of 65 days.

March " 602 " " 4½ " " " "

June " 49 " " 16 " " " "

Total 191½ " 68½

If Miss Melson will refer to paragraph 5 of the instructions to teachers on the back of the quarter
by school return, she will see that her school should be kept open at least 216 days in the year and that the aggre ate number of holidays, including Saturdays, Sundays and statutory holidays, must not, therefore, exceed 140 days. She taught only 1911 days out of the 216, as shown by the above statement, leaving 241 days
