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enable her peoples to face again the hardships of another Winter. The promise of continued assistance toward recovery will help to serve the larger need. Without aid, however, such have conditions become that the people may despair. The impression abo e all which one gains, at this time, is that this is indeed one world, and that if nations are to save themselves from the appallin consequences of continuous discontent, their salvation will only be found in the salvation of other nations. The hope for the world of today lies in closer and more effective co-operation among all free nations to ensure preservation of freedom itself.

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
