Before Mr. Fullford had said 'goodbye' - a little child came and spoke
or sang. We could not make it out, but concluded it might have been
one of Rogers' little children.

Bertha Fields: This was a relation of Miss ~~Field~~ ^{Field} who died last year. She spoke very sympathetically and affectionately about a sister who apparently in danger of some incurable trouble. She said she was sorry that there was nothing that could be done to help her, but that it would not be long now before her suffering would be at an end.

Miss Fields was a good "bridge" ^{bridge} "player" when she was alive. Miss ~~Fields~~ ^{Field} made some reference to this, and she replied ~~we had~~ there are "no cords" here, and spoke as if she were dead in her 50's.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier came next. He spoke of a change coming in 1935. By that time there would well be a fountain of flowing love and harmony - meanwhile conditions would be bad.

He spoke of being pleased to see us all, and asked Miss Fullford if Lady Laurier had not told her of a little girl Mary had who had died before she was born. Miss Fullford said no. She said 'I thought my wife had told you of that' - (mention was made also he spoke at our last interview of this daughter - I asked Miss Fullford afterwards, if she had ever heard of her. She said no - doubtless for this reason Sir Wilfrid brought in subject of himself.)
