Dear Sir:-

Replying to your letter of the 4th instant, I beg to advise that the fyles show that the Peers Anderson permit was cancelled and that very little merchantable timber was left on the Reserve. There are only scattered trees and it is impossible to make an estimate of the amount as it can not be cruised in the ordinary way. What is left is apparently what the logging company considered of no value and it would appear that charging full stumpage is not quite fair to the Indian as he does not receive as much for the class of timber as the logging company received for theirs.
