And should it be found that the Founder's estate was conveyed over to the Fraser Institute under those false accounts of Menzies: then, in that ease, to have the said conveyance of the Founder's estate to the Fraser Institute declared illegal, null and void, as if not made!

That the present Governors of the Fraser Institute have rendered themselves each liable and accountable to the heirs of the late Hugh Fraser for the full value of his estate, with all interests, profits, etc., since and after his death, for the reasons herein set forth;

That the said Fraser Institute should be called upon to show by what right they hold the estate of the said late Hugh–Fraser, and under what accounts the Founder's estate was conveyed over to the Fraser Institute?

Wherefore I pray for justice, for common British justice and British fair play in this cause, on behalf of myself and my poor co-heirs, who have been illegally deprived of their rights and interests in the estate of the late Hugh Fraser, the Founder, by the illegal acts of the Trustees of his estate and the Governors of the Fraser In 'inte, acting in collusion as herein set forth.

And J make this solemn declaration conscientiously, believing it to be true, and knowing that it is of the same force and effect as if made under oath, and by virtue of the Canada Evidence Act of 1893.
