

## POSTOFFICE—PROVINCIAL RATES OF LETTERS.

Letters to any part of Canada, if prepaid, 5 cents per ½ oz.  
Do. do unpaid, 7 do do  
and so on, advancing one rate for each half ounce.

CANADIAN NEWSPAPERS (if paid quarterly in advance)—  
Daily, 40 cents, Tri-weekly, 20 cents; Semi-weekly, 13 cents; Weekly, 6½ cents. This may be paid either by the publisher or the subscriber. Papers not paid thus are charged one cent on delivery.

Letters to any part of the five provinces charged one uniform rate of 5 cents per half ounce, optionally prepaid with postage stamps; or money may be used in prepayment of letters.

Letters to British Columbia, 10 cents; papers, 2 cents.

Letters, &c., for the United States, posted at any office in Canada, addressed to any part in the United States, except California and Oregon, are to be rated with a uniform rate of sixpence currency per half ounce.

Money letters to the United States may be registered, on payment of 3d, besides the 6d postage.

Letters posted in any part of the United States, except California and Oregon, addressed to Canada, will be rated with a uniform charge of ten cents, equal to 6d currency per half ounce.

The postage rate of letters passing between Canada and California and Oregon, will be a uniform charge of 10 cents per half ounce.

Canadian newspapers, &c., posted in Canada, addressed to the United States, must be prepaid by stamp.

Canadian newspapers, &c., posted in and addressed to any part of Canada, must be prepaid by stamp from the publication office, which go as above

Postage on Periodicals to any part of Canada or the United States, 1 cent per 4 oz. or fractions of 4 oz.

### SURROGATE COURTS FOR 1867.

For Granting letters of Administration, Probates of Wills, etc., sittings this year will be as follows:—

January—Commences first Monday of January, and ends Saturday following.

April---Commences first Monday of April, and ends the following Saturday.

July---Commences first Monday of July and ends the following Saturday.

October---Commences first Monday of October, and ends the following Saturday.
