

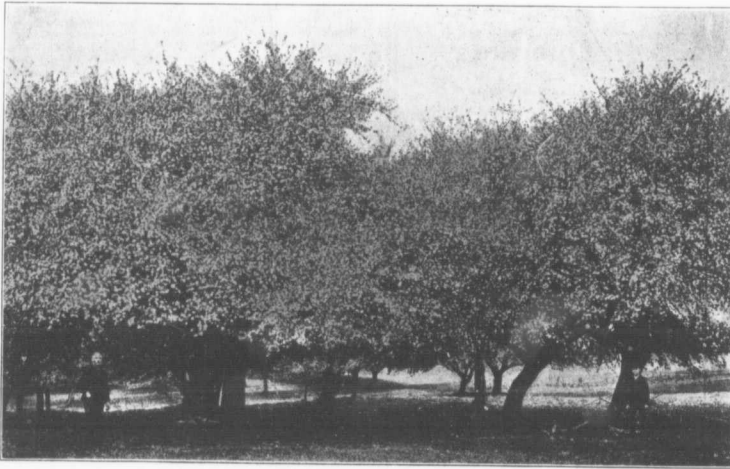

THESE ARE VERY REMOTE POSSIBILITIES OF GETTING FRUIT FROM AN ORCHARD IN THIS CONDITION

Good fruit rarely, if ever, is obtained from apple trees in a condition as here pictured. Yet, while this orchard presents a complicated problem in pruning, and is in need of such treatment about as badly as any orchard can be, we would have Farm and Dairy readers remember that it was with just such orchards as this that the splendid results were obtained last year through the work of the Fruit Branch of the Ontario Department of Agriculture and the District Representatives, who took over neglected orchards and pruned, scraped and sprayed the trees, and cultivated the soil about them. Where labor is available, the summer season is one of the best times to prune, and there is yet time to put a neglected orchard into shape.
