We imported from Minnesota some Shorthorn heifers, heavy with calf. Should these calves be registered in the Canadian or American herd book? Where is the Canadian herd book kept, and who has charge of it

Ans.—People who expect to sell in the American market frequently keep their cattle registered in both books but if it is expected to make most of the sales in Canada, there would be no need to register in the States. In order to register American-bred cattle in the Canadian book, the ancestors back to imported stock would have to be registered. #### HENS EATING EGGS

Would you kindly let me hear through your valuable columns of cure for hens eating their eggs? They are all young pullets, just starting to lay, and I am at a loss to know what to do to prevent it. H. P.

Ans.—Arrange the nests so that the eggs will be in darkness. This may be done by facing them toward the wall with a narrow passage for entrance, or, if separate nest boxes are used, turn them toward the wall, and hang a piece of old sacking partially across the front. The idea is to keep the egg out of sight. If this does not work, try a false bottom of canvas in the nest, sloping, so that the egg will roll down underneath as soon as laid. Feed vegetable matter, meat and grit.

### COLLECTING OLD ACCOUNT

In the winter of 1907 I did coniderable work for a homesteader in the way of hauling lumber and coal, supplied him with grain, and beef, etc., so that now he owes me quite a large bill, which he will not pay. He keeps putting it off, even when he has money. He will prove up on his homestead in about six months. How can I force a settlement '

Ans.—Give the case to a lawyer to make the collection, or to get some satisfaction.
