RESOLVED, That the Bill further to continue for a limited time, the Acts of the thirty-ninth and forty-second years of his Majesty's reign, which grant further encouragement, and a more ample allowance to the *Maitres* and *Aides de Poste* in this Province, be referred to a Committee of five Members; to enquire if any and what amendments are necessary, and report the same with all convenient speed: and that the said Committee have power to send for persons and papers.

ORDERED, That Mr. *Planté*, Mr. *Berthelot*, Mr. *De Salaberry* Mr. *Bourdage* and Mr. *Bedard*, do compose the said Committee.

A Bill further to continue for a limited time an Act passed in the thirty sixth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for making a temporary provision for the regulation of trade between this Province and the *United States of America*, by land or by inland navigation;" was, according to order, read for the second time.

On motion of Mr. *Berthelot*, seconded by Mr. *Bourdage*,

ORDERED, That the said Bill be ingrossed,

And then, on motion of Mr. *Berthelot*, seconded by Mr. *Bourdage*.
