" ance to the Maitres and Aides de Poste in this Province." was, according to order, read for the second time.

On motion of Mr. Planté, seconded by Mr. Berthelot,

RESOLVED. That the Bill further to continue for a limited time, the Acts of the thirty ninth and forty second years of his Majesty's reign, which grant further encouragement, and a more ample allowance to the Maitres and Aides de Poste in this Province, be referred to a Committee of five Members; to enquire if any and what amendments are necessary, and report the same with all convenient speed: and that the said Committee have power to send for persons and papers.

Ordered, That Mr. Planté, Mr. Berthelot, Mr. De Salaberry Mr. Bourdage and Mr. Bedard, do compose the faid Committee.

A Bill further to continue for a limited time an Act passed in the thirty sixth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for mak-" ing a temporary provision for the regulation of trade between this "Province and the *United States* of *America*, by land or by inland na-" vigation;" was, according to order, read for the second time.

On motion of Mr. Berthelot, seconded by Mr. Bourdage,

ORDERED, That the faid Bill be ingrossed,

And then, on motion of Mr. Berthelot, seconded by Mr. Bourdage.

The House adjourned to Friday next.
