not be allowed to vote upon any question, which shall arise in the course of the trial, or upon the determination thereof.

No member to vote who has not attended during the whole of the trial.

Perfons fwearing falfely, inall incur the penalties of perjury. VII. Provided always, That no fuch determination as aforefaid, shall be made, nor any question be proposed, unless there be a quorum of the Houses and no Member shall have a vote on such determination, or any other question, or resolution, who has not attended during the whole of the trial.

VIII. And be it further Enacted by the Authority afore/aid, That the oaths by this Act directed to be taken, thall be administered by the Clerk of the Houfe, and that any perfon who thall be guilty of wilful and corrupt perjury, in any evidence, which he thall give before the Houfe, in confequence of the oath, which he thall have taken by the direction of this Act, thall, on conviction thereof, incur, and fuffer the like pains and penalties, to which any other perfon convicted of wilful and corrupt perjary is liable, by the Laws and Statutes of this Province.

W HEREAS Articles of Provisional Agreement, were made, and entered into at Montreal, on the fifth day of July, in the loty fourth year of your Majefty's reign, by the Commillioners nominated and appointed on behalf of the Province of Upper Canada, by His Excellency Peter Humer Efquire, Lieutenant Governor of the faid Province, by commission, bearing date the twenty-fecond day of March, in the forty-fourth year of your Majeftty's reign, in purfuance of, and under the authority of an Act, passed in the thrty-feventh year of your Majefty's reign, intituled, "An Act to authorize the "Lieutenant Governor to nominate and appoint certain Commissioners for the purposes therein mentioned," and the Commissioners nominated and appointed on behalf of the Province of Lower Canada, by an Act of the Provincial Parliament thereof, passed in the forty-fourth year of your Majefty's reign, inituled, "An Act for appointing Commissioners to treat with the Commissioners appointed, or to be appointed, on the part of Upper Canada, for the purposes therein mentioned," which agreement is as follows :--

The faid Commissioners having met, and communicated to each other their refpective powers and authorities, and having taken into confideration, and maturely deliberated upon the objects of their appointment, and finding, that "no material alteration hathtaken place in the relative fituation of the two Pro-
