Lessons From the Life of Haydn

Great Musician's Qualities Discussed by Rev. L. Brown.

On Sunday evening following the giving of Part I of the Creation by the Choir of First Baptist church, Rev. Lewellyn Brown, the pastor, spoke for a few minutes upon "Some Lessons from the life of Haydn." He said in part as follows:

"You are not studying the life of I

"You are not studying the life of Haydn long before you are impressed with the magnanimity of his soul. He was a great musician in every sense of the word, but his great gifts sense of the word, but his great gifts both native and acquired, did not make him blind to great gifts in other men. He appreciated the good and the beautiful wherever he saw it and the beautiful where the beautiful was free to acknowledge the same. This is, no doubt, one reason, at least, why he was called by his musical friends, "Papa" Haydn and here is a quality of life we do well to copy. It is harder sometimes to rejoice with those who do rejoice, than it is to weep with those who weep. Haydn all who showed exceptional gifts, along his own line, and herein he along his own line, and herein he showed the largeness of his own soul. Another lesson we may learn from Haydn is this: Poverty is no bar to success. It may be an annoyance, but success. It may be an annoyance, but it is no unsurmountable obstacle in the pathway of any man of ability, who is willing to work. Haydn was born in poverty, nourished in poverty, battered and haddened by poverty but battered and badgered by poverty, but he was never overcome by it, but it served as a spur to patient endurance. He slept for a time in Vienna in a garret, polished the shoes of his master in voice production for lessons ter in voice production for lessons terms and in every way given in return, and in every way no man, after reading Haydn's life say he cannot succeed because he is poor. Any man possessed of fair ability, who is willing to work, can succeed, and the greater his ability and devotion to his task the greater.
