STATISTICS OF THE AUSTRIAN RED CROSS.

Canada's Record Can Stand Comparison.

The International Red Cross Bulletin gives some interesting facts about the working of the Austrian Red Cross. Up to the end of April, 1915, the cash receipts amounted to 16,300,000 Kronen. Over 7,000,000 of this came from Vienna alone, and over one million was contributed from abroad, presumably for the most part from America. All accounts are inspected and this expenditure is controlled by a committee of financial experts.

Canada's contribution of approximately \$6,000,000 to Red Cross Funds, considering population, bears more than favorable comparison with this. Austrian contribution of \$8,000,000. An interesting item in the Austrian Society's activities is its maintenance of three hospital ships and 12 hospital trains. However anything like a complete report of the Red Cross in Austria is unobtainable so that one is liable to estimate with what completeness Austria copes with its Red Cross obligation which must be of extraordinary magnitude. Brief as is this information about a hostile Red Cross Society, it should serve as a stimulus to our own Canadian Society which in the relief of the wounded should acquit itself honorably in this world Red Cross rivalry.
