Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may home stead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manrioba, Saskatrhewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (out not Sub-Agency,) on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon an cutivation of the land in each of thre years. A homesteader may live with nine miles of his nonestead on a farm at least 80 acres, on certain conditi n A habitable house is required except wher residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader i good standing may ore-empt a quarter good standing may ore-empt a quarter

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestean patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation Pre-emption patent may be obtained a soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

Asettler who has exhausted his home-stead right may take a purchased home-stead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 pe acre. Duties—Must reside six month out of three years, cultivate \$0 acres and erect a house worth \$300.

The arr of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of ough, scrubby or tony iana. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
