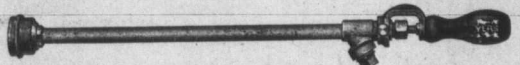

### WOLFVILLE NEWS.

Yesterday was tried before stipendiary J. S. Strong at Kentville from the Lockhartville section. It was on the complaint of William Bowby against Austin Bowby for committing an assault occasioning bodily harm on Amanda Bowby.

We have been hearing of a case of bigamy in which a resident

of Lockhartville and a returned soldier's wife was implicated. It has now been aired in court and the persons implicated sent up for trial. The facts according to the evidence that John Kelley of Lockhartville married Lena Berry in April, 1917 she at that time being the wife of Edward Williams of Brooklyn St. then on active service William returned from overseas and approving of the actions of his wife he instituted proceedings and Kelley and Mrs. Williams have been sent up for trial, the case against Kelley being heard yesterday before Stipendiary J. B. Oakes yesterday at Kentville. He was admitted to bail to appear before the Supreme Court. Mrs. Williams's case will be heard before Judge Webster, under the Speedy Trials act.
