## SUICIDE OF A WITNESS

Tried Beyond Endurance in Toronto's Civic Inquiry.

Q. D. McCulloch, Secretary of the Bennett & Wright Contracting and Plumbing Co., Ends Life With Carbolic Acid In His Garden—He Was One of the Best Known Bowlers in the Province and Generally Popular.

Toronto, June 27.—Worried to desperation, as his friends say, through his connection, as a witness, on behalf of his employers, in the civic enquiry, Q. D. McCulloch, 623 Ontario street, secretary of the Bennett & Wright Contracting and Plumbing Co., and a prominent bowler and curler, ended his life on the lawn back of his residence yesterday morning. An improvised pillow of clothes taken from the line was placed under his head and a vial which had contained carbolic acid lay beside him when he was found.

Mr. McCulloch rose yesterday morning earlier than usual, ate a fairly hearty breakfast, and seemed to be preparing to go to the office. He displayed a little more than the usual affection toward his family, and bid them good-by. He then went into the garden and was later discovered dead.

Mr. McCulloch was extremely popular with all who knew him. He was born Quebec Province 49 years ago, and moved to Toronto 20 years since. A wife, two sons and a daughter survive him, all of whom reside at home.

He was vice-president of the Granite Club, which club he had been associated with about one year, and for 12 years he was secretary of the Ontario Bowling Association. He was a co-author of a manual on bowling published last year and was one of the few who are capable of preparing the bowling schedules.

When His Honor Judge Winchester was informed of the tragedy he was shocked.

Crown Attorney Drayton was deeply grieved to hear of the sad occurrence. "Mr. McCulloch was not to figure at all in the coming cases of course he had not been subpoenaed," said Mr. Drayton.

## AWAITS GRAND JURY'S ACTION.

Harry K. Thaw Held For the Murder of Stanford White.

New York, June 27.—Frankly admitting that he killed Stanford White, the famous architect, and pleading in justification of the deed that White had ruined the life of his wife, the beautiful former chorus girl and artists' model, Florence Evelyn Nesbit, Harry Kendall Thaw of Pittsburgh, brother of the countess of Yarmouth, occupies a cell in the Tombs awaiting the action of the grand jury on a charge of murder.

His counsel will offer the defence of insanity, and yesterday the prisoner was examined by eminent alienists retained on his behalf, and by the district attorney's office.

The coroner's inquest will be held on Thursday.

## MONEY IN IT.

Handbook Operators Reap Large Profits, So Books Show.

Toronto, June 27.—The men charged with making handbooks on the races and the frequenters of their places appeared in the Police Court yesterday. They did not elect or plead. At the request of their counsel, Mr. Robinson, a remand was granted until Friday.

Examination of the books seized by the police show that those controlling them made a weekly profit of \$50 to \$100, according to the amount of business done.

**Dear Mute Killed On Track.**  
 St. John, N. B., June 27.—Freeman Leaman, a deaf mute, was instantly killed near Sussex yesterday morning. He was walking on the railroad track to work, when a special military train came along, and Leaman, not hearing the whistle or bell, was horribly crushed. He left a wife and several children.

## FORCED TO EAT BOOKS.

Human Beings Who Were Compelled to Devour Literature.

Among the causes that contribute to the destruction of books, says an Italian writer, Americo Scarlatti, there is one very curious one that may be called Bibliophagia. No reference is intended to the mice that once destroyed in England an entire edition of Castelli's "Lexicon Heptaglotton," but to human beings who have literally devoured books.

In 1370 Barnabo Visconti compelled two papal delegates to eat the bull of excommunication which they had brought him, together with its silken cords and leaden seal. As the bull was written on parchment, says the Scientific American, not paper, it was all the more difficult to digest.

A similar anecdote was related by Oelrich in his "Disertatio de Bibliothecarum et Librorum Fata" (1769) of an Austrian general who had signed a note for 2,000 florins and when it fell due compelled his creditors to eat it.

The Tartars, when books fall into their possession, eat them that they may acquire the knowledge contained in them.

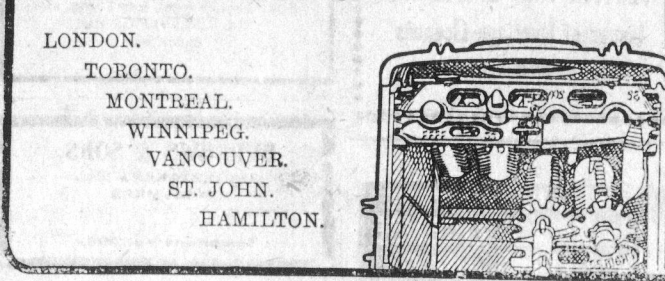
A Scandinavian writer, the author of a political book, was compelled to choose between being beheaded or eating his manuscript boiled in broth.

Still worse was the fate of Philip Oldenburger, a jurist of great renown, who was condemned not only to eat a pamphlet of his writings, but also to be flogged during his repast, with orders that the flogging should not cease until he had swallowed the last crumb.
