

# THE JEWS FOR VICTIMS

Douma Says Government Incited Class Against Class.

Lower House of Parliament Scores Heavily-Expresses Distrust of Ministry and Demands Its Resignation -Calling In Guards-Syzran Wiped Out by Fire and 35,000 People Are Homeless and Without Food.

St. Petersburg, July 21.—At the opening session of the Lower House yesterday the question of the publication of the address to the country, which President Mouromtzen Thursday night decided had not been carried owing to the lack of a quorum, was allowed to go over until Monday.

Without debate the House then adopted a resolution on the subject of the Bialystok massacre, demanding the prosecution of the military and police officials involved, irrespective of rank. Strong Indictment.

The resolution, which constitutes a strongly worded indictment of the central Government, which is held responsible for the secret propaganda inciting class against class, says:

"Realizing its powerlessness to suppress the revolutionary movement the Government attempts to break it up by inciting one portion of the population against the other, especially selecting the Jews for victims."

The resolution concludes with another expression of distrust of the ministry and a demand for its resignation.
