TORY IN BIRMINGHAM.

Birmingham, April 5 .- The police raided a suspected locality in Ledsan Street, programme :-Ladywood, and discovered a fenian nitroglycerine factory in full operation there. The apparatus for preparing and mixing the explosive compound was constructed on scientific principles, which clearly showed its inventor to be not only a thorough scholar in chemistry and machinery but an adept in expedients for preventing discovery. Among the noteworthy features of the place was a shrewdly devised method for carrying the fumes up the chimney and consumin the odors. It has been learned that the premises in Ledhall Street were taker two months ago by a man named White head, an Irish-American, who had a sign hung out in front of the place indicating his business-that of a paper hanger Whitehead was taken into custody when the police made their descent. A considerable quantity of nitro-glycerine was seized. Information now in the hands of the detectives tends to demonstrate that the place is a central manufactory of ex plosives and the most important depot of all infernal contrivances in the kingdom. Whitehead, who is described as about 25 years of age, dark in complexion and with marked American accent, has been in the habit of purchasing supplies of glycerine and acids which were necessary to run the business.
