Lord Haldane Visits Germany

Special to Evening Telegram. LONDON, To-day. The Foreign Office authorizes the following statement respecting the visit to Berlin of Lord Haldane, the Secretary of War. Lord Haldane is the President of the Royal Commission on University Education and has gone to Berlin to investigate scientific education in German Universities, but as he is well known to many leading people in Germany he will doubtless have some general conversations on the political situation and the relation between the two countries.

AN APPRECIATION.

A message was received in town yesterday announcing the sad news that Mr. Edward O'Leary, Sub-Collector and Wreck Commissioner, died at one o'clock. In the death of Mr. O'Leary Renewes loses one of its oldest and best citizens, he was born there in 1834. Edward O'Leary was a splendid type of the fisherman planter, a shrewd, keen, observant man, progressive in his ideas and practical in everything relating to the fisheries of the country. One of his strongest characteristics was his hospitality, to spend a few hours with "Skipper Ned" and enjoy his fund of humorous and droll sayings was a treat, and an index of the fine types that the old times produced; he was immense on a good election story or the tale of a wreck, especially if there was a funny side to it. He was richly endowed with the humorous characteristics of his Celtic forefathers, yet the serious side of life was never overlooked. In his religious life he was an earnest, practical Catholic, and in his dealings with his fellowman his word was his bond. The death of his wife and daughter within the past few years cast a shadow over the evening of his life, and although he was bright and cheerful, yet to the writer he often expressed in feeling language his sense of loss and respect to the memory of his life partner and child. He leaves one son, Arthur, and two daughters, Miss Mary O'Leary and Mrs. John Morry, of Fermeuse. He will be buried on Sunday in the quiet little cemetery at Renewes by the side of those who in life he loved so well.—R.I.P.—Com.

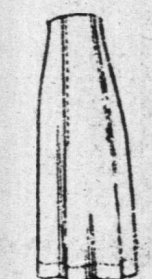
