Two Airships Collide In mid-air and both Aeronauts Were Killed.

Doual, France, June 19.—Capt. Dubois and Lieuts. Albert Peignan, both officers in the French army and trained airmen, met tragic deaths this morning when the bi-planes they were piloting round the military grounds collided with terrific force

The two officers who were close friends were unable to perceive each other while flying through the early morning haze, which was very dense in the vicinity of the aerodrome, where they started practising soon after daybreak. As they turned a curve their machines collided with an awful impact as they were traveling at a high rate of speed.

The wire stays and canvas wings became interlocked and the two biplanes crashed to the ground, where they were smashed into a mass of

Lieut. Peignan was taken dead from among the debris but Capt. Dubois was still living although his injuries were of such a serious nature that he died within an


