This airplane has a seating acity for 14 passengers in addition the necessary staff; on its trial it carried 12 passengers, pilot and stant, and attained an altitude of 0 feet in 71/4 minutes with an air ed of 125 miles an hour. The pasiger saloon is scientifically venti ed to avoid drafts, and straps are needed for passengers, as on this ss of meahine rolling and pitching scarcely noticeable . The machine asures 2014 feet high and from tip tip measures 81½ feet. ditor Evening Telegram. Dear Sir:-On board the schooner mprimus, commanded by Capt. M. Pelley, somewhere in the Caribean sea, I write this note or sketch of our trip since leaving St. John's last summer. Meanwhile apologizing for all my deficiencies and inaccuracies, rusting my readers will forgive same as it is written on the spur of the cement, and without previous study. On August the fifth, 1918, we sailed ish laden from St. John's for Martinque, a historic island owned by the French in the West Indies, and arived there nineteen days later. After lischarging cargo and docking for repairs we again loaded for Marseilles, beautiful city in the south of France, but found to our chagrin we were not allowed to sail owing o some Admiralty rules, which we vere ignorant of until ready to clear. We were now detained in the placid arbor of Port au France two months onger, which caused our alert and energetic captain no small annoy ance and dissatisfaction when the rder came to free the port. During ur detention at Martinique we visit of St. Pierre and gazed upon the ruins of that once gay city, now sad and silent after being lashed into Mount Pelee. Above the historic ruins, under which thousands sleep their last watch, Mount Pelee still towers and smokes and watches over those whom its devouring fiames cremated alive.
