Meaney then addressed the gathering on their experiences at the Irish er part of his address to demonstrating the absolute dissociation of the Irish cause and religious issues, and Mr. Meaney eloquently handled the political and historic side of the question, warmly denouncing the campaign of misrepresentation and calumny which was being waged by propagandist news services and the assistance given thereto by the local press. He reiterated his assertion at the Convention "Ireland never could and never will again trust the word of an English statesman." Mr. Meaney's speech evoked thunderous

applause. After a vote of thanks to the speakers had been passed by acclamation the following resolutions were adopted. The gathering standing in silence for some moments.
