The Grenfell staff on this part of the Newfoundland coast are endeavoring to educate the people to give up eating white flour, when it is so difficult for them to purchase it, and to live more fully on the meal of coarser grains, such as oatmeal, cornmeal and rye. Potatoes, too, are included in the dietary curriculum laid down, the idea being to exclude wheat flour altogether. But potatoes and other vegetables are but scantily cultivated on that part of the coast between Port Saunders and Cape John. been earning \$2.50 a day on road work, was the plaintiff in an action for assault before Mr. McCarthy, J.P., in the Magistrate's Court this morning.
