The attendance was large and much interest was manifested. Ald. Taylor was called to the chair, and after briefly stating the objects of the meeting, requested Mayor Taylor to address the meeting.

He challenged the Mayor to show in any single department where he had made such a saving. He calimed also that the recent reduction of taxes was largely due to him, for previous to his entering the Council Chamber the taxes were steadily increasing, but under the management of affairs by the present Council the rate had been reduced 2 mills. The \$80,000 which was to be raised by debentures would be used to extend the waterworks and for school purposes, and the palance would doubtless effect a reduction in the rate of taxation by about 3 or 4 mills if it was so applied, but it was not likely it would be applied in such a manner.
