**OXFORD WON!**

Exciting Race of the English University Eight.

The Oxford Lead the Cambridge Lads Only Quarter of a Length.

**THE OAR.**

**THE RACE.**—The 48th of the famous boat races between the crews of Oxford and Cambridge universities was decided this morning. It was won by a quarter of a length by Oxford. The time of the race was 22 minutes. The race was over the usual course, which starts at a point about 100 yards above Putney bridge, near London, and finishes at Mortlake. Only four starters besides the judge's launch were allowed to follow the race. In addition to the four in-hand loaded steamers and barges moored along the river, the house tops, towpaths, streets and other points of vantage near the Thames at Putney itself and at Mortlake were crowded with spectators, while thousands of carriages of every description, from the donkey to the four-in-hand, lined the river banks, and were to be seen lining the river bank.

As usual Oxford's admirers displayed a wealth of dark blue ribbons, rosettes and other ornaments, while the flags of Cambridge made a lavish display of light blue silk. Of the 47 races rowed previous to the Oxford-Cambridge race, the time of the race was 22 minutes. The English record for the Putney course is 19 minutes, 25 seconds, made by Cambridge in 1873. As soon as the two crews put in an appearance on the Thames on March 23, critics noticed that the Oxford crew was a strong pulling crew, rowing capably together with a long swing and plenty of life. The Cambridge crew were a rather ragged combination. All the men seemed to row in a different style, but they improved considerably with practice and increased on the Thames. It was simply magnificent. Oxford had all the work she could do out for her as the boats rounded Barnes bend of the river. Cambridge was rowing pluckily with plenty of strength, but Oxford passed over the line first by a quarter of a length amid intense, almost indescribable excitement, winning the grandest race rowed on the Thames in many years.
