THE DAWN OF THE CENTURY. (Lond on Saturday Review.)

(London Saturday Review.)
We hear a good deal just now of the latter
days of the century; perhaps a few words
about the dawn of the century may not be
altogether ill-timed or unwelcome.
It was the heyday of stamp and paper
duties; there were about half a dozen newsduties; there were about half a dozen newspapers, too dear for the multitude to buy, and probably only published, like the Quarterly and Edinburgh Reviews, for the select few to read. There was no gas. Oil lamps enlivened the streets, and at the theaters candlet, supposed to be wax, dripped down the back of your dress clothes.
