


SADIE V. MAUSBY, Chicago specialist, is going in search of a magic elixir said to have been discovered by European scientists and which changes old faces into new.

Flee From Famine and Pestilence.




GERMANS fled into Russia on growing promises of good fortune made by the Bolsheviks are now making frantic efforts to return to the fatherland.

Winners of English Rowing Classic.




