



# **GEORGIAN CANDIDATES A POOR FOURTH IN VOTING**

Any Chance of Him Having Balance of Power Position in House Was Lost When First-Returns Started To Come—Women Were Out of Luck.

Special Cable to The Advertiser, London, Nov. 16.-Ex-Premier Lloyd George has been defeated in his effort to win a balance of power in the next House of Commons on the face of incomplete returns this afternoon. A count made at 1 p.m. showed the Conservative candidates of Bonar Law with a clear majority over all other parties, and the Conservatives were gaining at that time, having won nine

additional seats since the noon results were posted. Lloyd George's candidates were a bad fourth in the running, but this did not affect the results from his point of view, so much as the fact that Bonar Law appeared likely to secure a working majority, and hence Lloyd George's handful in the house would not be sufficient to overthrow the

The new house will be composed of 615 members, so there remains room for considerable change in one direction or another.
