The officers of the National Association have the power to drive the thieves from the turf, and there should be no delay in doing it. The men who put their heads together to rob the public in this manner, cannot turn their hand to the earning of an honest penny, and if they can be starved out of existence by omitting circuit meetings for a time—long or short—the general public will be satisfied to allow the trotters to graze in peace and quiet for a few years, and the owners of parks to raise hay and oats upon their grounds."
