The third voiume, now out, treats of servitudes, emphyteusis and the greater part of the law of succession. The title of "Successions" occupies 400 pages. The reader will find in examining this portion of the work a number of subjects on which the author has bestowed considerable research. Among many topics which might be indicated are those of successions devolving to ascendants and collaterals, discharge of the beneficiary heir, persons who are bound to make returns, effects of partition, etc. Mr. Mignault's work is sure to make its way into the library of every practitioner and into the hands of all who wish to acquire an accurate knowledge of Quebec civil law.

NEW ARITHMETIC.

F. E. Grafton & Sons have just issued the fourth book in their graded arithmetic series. It is a fine text book, taking the pupil up to university work, and giving a table of logarithms which is useful for pupils of even higher grades.
