2:36 trot; purse \$185; \$75, 80, 20, 10.
Second day—County trot for horses that never won
money; purse \$100; \$50, 25, 15, 10.
Pacing race; purse \$90; \$50, 25, 15.
1½ mile dash; purse \$120; T C W.; foreign breds 12
lbs extra, including Lady D'Arcy; \$100, 20.
Open trot; purse \$175; \$90, 40, 30, 15.
Three to enter and two to start; where three start
only two moneys will be paid; two starting, one money.
Entrance, ten per cent. of purse. All races according
to the National Association rules. Entries close 17th
June.

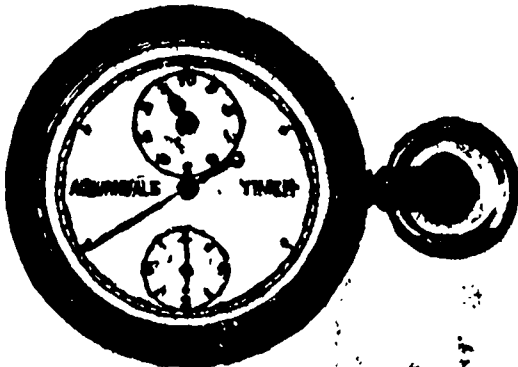
Brantford, June 24th & 25th.

First day—Trotting. 4 year olds and under; purse
\$150; \$75, 35, 25, 15.
Running mile heats; purse \$125; T C W., foreign
breds 12 lbs extra, including Lady D'Arcy; \$100, 25.
2:36 class; purse \$175; \$90, 40, 30, 15.
Second day—Open to all pacers; purse \$150; \$75,
35, 25, 15.
3 minute class, bar Garafraze and May Morning;
purse \$175; \$90, 40, 30, 15.
Trotting, free for all; purse \$250; \$125, 60, 40, 25.
Entrance, ten per cent. of purse, and must accom-
pany the nomination in every instance. Entries close
at 8 o'clock p.m. on Tuesday, June 22nd. The purses
are all guaranteed, and will be paid at the close of each
race at Oxendale's hotel. Four horses to enter, three to
start, except the running race, when three to enter and
two to start. Horses distancing the field will only be
entitled to first money. All races according to the Na-
tional Association rules.

Scott, that have no record; \$45, 25, 10.
Second day—Trotting; purse \$175; for colts 4 years
old and under, that are bred, raised and owned in On-
tario, mile heats, two in three; \$100, 50, 25.
Running, 1½ mile dash; purse \$190; Province breds
allowed 10 lbs, except to Lady D'Arcy; \$100, 20.
Trotting, for 2:36 class; purse \$125; \$75, 30, 20.
Pacing race; purse \$90; \$50, 25, 15.
Entries for steeplechase to close June 22nd, other en-
tries to close June 28th. Dominion Turf Club rules to
govern running races; trotting to be governed by Na-
tional Association rules. A horse distancing the field
will be entitled to first money only.

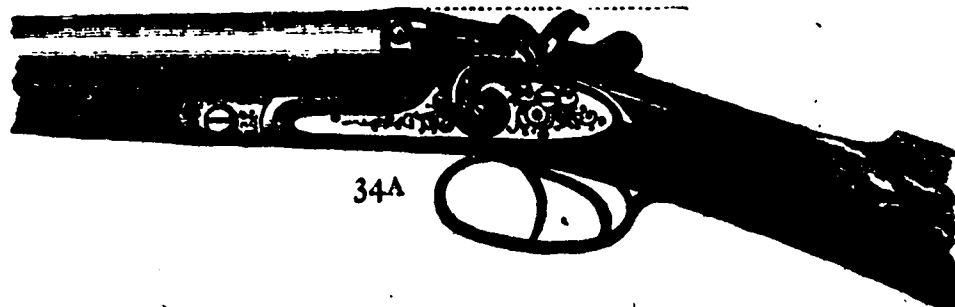

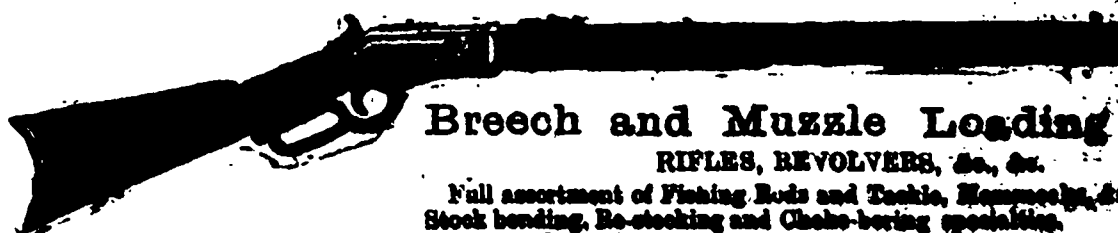
