

FOURTH ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL TO THE BRUSSELS AGREEMENT OF DECEMBER 5, 1947, RELATING TO THE RESOLUTION OF CONFLICTING CLAIMS TO GERMAN ENEMY ASSETS, SIGNED IN BRUSSELS, ON APRIL 30, 1952

The Governments Parties to the present Protocol,

Desiring to extend from January 24, 1952 to May 24, 1952, the time stipulated in the Article 23 of the Brussels Agreement of December 5, 1947, relating to the Resolution of conflicting Claims to German Enemy Assets ⁽¹⁾,

Have agreed as follows:

ARTICLE 1

The provisions of the first sentence of the Article 23 of the Brussels Agreement are modified as follows:

No Party shall be obliged to release property under this Part, in respect of which no claim, sponsored by another Party, has been received by the former Party, within sixteen months after the coming into force of the Agreement between the respective Parties;

ARTICLE 2

The present Protocol shall come into force, between the Governments on behalf of which the instrument has been signed (or ratified or approved by Governments signing subject to ratification or approval) as soon as the last instrument of ratification has been deposited in Brussels.

ARTICLE 3

The present Protocol shall be open for signature by any Government which is eligible for signature of the Brussels Agreement.

ARTICLE 4

The present Protocol shall be considered to be an integral part of the Brussels Agreement.

In witness whereof the undersigned, being duly authorised by their respective Governments, have signed the present Protocol.

Done in Brussels, on April 30, 1952, in the English and French languages, the two texts being equally authentic, in a single original which shall be deposited in the Archives of the Government of Belgium.
