2. The Requested State shall invite the person to assist in the investigation or to appear as a witness in the proceedings and seek that person's concurrence thereto. Upon making the request to appear, the Requesting State shall indicate the travel expenses and allowances that it will pay.

ARTICLE 10

MAKING DETAINED PERSONS AVAILABLE TO GIVE EVIDENCE OR ASSIST INVESTIGATIONS

- A person in the custody of the Requested State whose presence in the Requesting State is needed for purposes of assistance under this Treaty shall be transferred to the Requesting State for that purpose if the person and the Requested State consent to the transfer.
- 2. For the purposes of this Article:
 - the Requesting State shall have the authority and the obligation to keep the person transferred in custody unless otherwise indicated by the Requested State;
 - (b) the Requesting State shall return the person transferred to the Requested State as soon as circumstances permit or as otherwise agreed by the Central Authorities;
 - the Requested State shall not be required to initiate extradition proceedings for the return of the person transferred;
 - (d) the person transferred shall receive credit for service of the sentence imposed in the Requested State for time served in the Requesting State;
 - (e) the length of stay of a person in the Requesting State cannot exceed the period left to serve in that person's sentence or 90 days, whichever comes first, unless at the time of acceptance of the request that person and both States consent, to extend it for a reasonable time.

ARTICLE 11

SAFE CONDUCT

- Any person present in the Requesting State in response to a request pursuant
 to Articles 9 or 10, subject to Article 10(2)(a), shall not be prosecuted,
 detained or subjected to any other restriction of personal liberty in that State
 for any acts or omissions which preceded that person's departure from the
 Requested State, nor shall that person be obliged to give evidence in any
 proceeding other than the proceedings to which the request relates.
- Paragraph 1 of this Article shall cease to apply if a person, being free to leave the Requesting State, has not left it within a period of fifteen days after being officially notified that that person's attendance is no longer required or, having left that territory, has voluntarily returned.
- 3. Any person who fails to appear in the Requesting State may not be subjected to any sanction or compulsory measure in the Requested State.
