(d) and (e) It has not been customary to require crown corporations to disclose information of this kind and the C.B.C. believes that deviation from this policy could only prove detrimental to the corporation and its employees.

LENGTH OF SERVICE OF RETIRED OFFICERS

Hon. Léo Cadieux (Associate Minister of National Defence): 1. and 2. Vice Admiral Dyer has had continuous service with the Royal Canadian Navy from September 1, 1933, totalling 32 years and 317 days. He was promoted to his present rank on August 1, 1964, and was appointed chief of personnel the same date.

Lt. Gen. Moncel has had service in the Canadian army (active) and Canadian army (regular) totalling 25 years and 278 days, together with service in the Canadian army (reserves) totalling 3 years and 344 days. He was promoted to his present rank on August 1, 1964, and was appointed vice chief of the defence staff on September 2, 1965.

Lt. Gen. Fleury has had service in the Canadian army (active) and Canadian army (regular) totalling 25 years and 328 days, together with service in the Canadian army (reserves) totalling 8 years and 347 days. He was promoted to his present rank on September 2, 1965, and was appointed comptroller general the same date.

3. As stated in the House of Commons on 7 July, 1966, these retirements were by mutual understanding.
