If there be any other form of art so engaging, so amusing, so thoroughly delightful, or more calculated to render one oblivious to everything outside the immediate present than a good play, the public has not yet discovered it.

Last night's performance of "The White Feather" at the Royal Alexandra Theatre, which completely filled the house, were satisfied in every respect.

A good company can do nothing with poor play, and many a good play has been murdered by those responsible for its survival.

The patriotic feeling of the audience must be allowed for to some extent, but the authors do not transcend in this respect, but permeate the sentiment to be gathered instead of thrusting it across the footlights.

The play is a masterpiece of workmanship in "The White Feather" and many amusing situations.

The stage production is a combination of comedy, catchy music, dancing and unique features with fun of the laughing variety that is both infectious and lingering.

All the favorite characters of the dramatic are introduced and are cleverly portrayed while the production is distinctive in that it differs from the ordinary musical comedy.

The central character in the play, making it Jiggs Mahony, a good-natured Irishman, who has acquired a large fortune, and whose wife is anxious to get into society and ape those that are in it, or think they are.
