" Escurial, your Lordship's dispatches of

" the 28th past: And by the last post,

" I received your letter of the 20th of the

" same month, in which, &c." I suppose

the public was not to be trusted with all

" that letter."

What an idea must he have of the imprudence and indifcretion of the persons who were the writers, publishers, and curtailers of these letters, to suppose them capable of falling into fo gross a blunder, in a matter where the utmost caution was necesfary for their own fakes! The observer must imagine that these words, open my correspondence, were not in the real letter; but that they have been fince inferted, when these papers were prepared for parliament, in order to make believe, that it was the first letter wrote by Lord Egremont to Lord Bristol; for he cannot suppose that Lord. Egremont would use that expression in a letter dated the 28th, (at that time, certainly, not defigned to be shewn to parliament) if he had wrote him one in the same capacity
