Former Methodist Church, Now Centre of Yiddish Theatricals, Sold for About \$85,000.

Toronto's centre of Hebrew histrionics, the Lyric Theatre at the corner of Agnes and Teraulay-streets, has been sold to a syndleate headed by Mr. Scholes of the McKnight Construction Company for about \$85,000.

The theatre building was formerly the Agnes-street Methodist Church, which about five years ago, owing to the departure of the Gentiles from that neighborhood, affiliated with Elm-street Methodist Church.

Supt. of Schools Bishop Declares Land for Extensions Will Get Higher as Years Go By.

Superintendent Bishop is a member of the Big Eyes Club. For several years he has been pointing out the importance of the prompt purchase of sites for educational buildings.
