LIVE STOCK MARKET. Trading on the Live Stock Exchange yesterday was a steady one, but the market was marked by an active demand, with Wednesday's best prices well maintained, a good steady to strong trade, but less in the day found the market a very satisfactory one, and some of the commission houses were all cleaned up of stock.

Sheep and Lambs. Choice grain-fed yearlings, with wool on, sold yesterday from \$20 to \$23 per cwt.; medium yearlings sold from \$16 to \$17.50; light handys, \$15.50 to \$17; and heavy, fat sheep and bucks, \$14.75 to \$16.

Calves. Choice veal calves sold from \$14.50 to \$15; medium calves, \$12 to \$13.50; grassers and common calves, \$7.50 to \$9; and heavy, fat calves, \$11 to \$14. The medium class calves were lower and hard to sell, from \$5 to \$6 below Wednesday's market.

Hogs. The hog market was strong and 25c higher, selling at \$21, fed and watered, and \$21.25, weighed off cars.

SPECIAL MARKET NOTES. A feature of the market was the sale by Quinn & Hisey of a bunch of yearling steers, weighing around 900 lbs., at \$12.40 per cwt. They were a good lot, and for a bunch of that weight it is questionable if the price has been surpassed.
