BROOKDALE NYPH WINS THE OMNIUM HANDICAP

Johnny Blake Takes Golden Rod, Second Feature at Sheephead.

SHEEPSHEAD BAY, Sept. 15.—Brookdale Nymph, a 4 to 1 shot, won the Omnium Handicap here to-day, defeating the favorite, Dandelion, in a drive by half a length, with Old Honey third. Nicol who rode Dandelion, claimed a foul against the winner, but it was not allowed. Brookdale Nymph went to the front at the start and making the pace, won.

Johnny Blake won the Golden Rod stakes, Prince Hampton, 16 to 1 shot, made a new track record for one mile and three-quarters, when he won the fifth race of the track. He topped the distance in 2:05 4/5. The previous time was 2:00 3/4. Summary:
