Deceased had resided in the village for over 60 years, and had nearly reached his 90th year. He came here from Devonshire, England, and worked for many years at his calling of a mason, accumulating considerable wealth by dogged perseverance. He was thrice married, but Mr. Jas. Trott of Alma, Michigan, is the only surviving son. Up till within a few weeks he had been in his usual good health, and his death was not expected.
