New York, March 25.-Mystery sur-rounding the reported disappearance of Thor Dah', 20-year-old Norwegian "millionaire," from the steamship Ber-gensfjord in mid-ocean ten days ago, deepened today when it was learned that process servers awaited him with subpoenas when the vessel docked yes-terday.

They wanted him as a witness against Detectives John J. Gunson and Jos. Maloney, both under indictments charging bribery and extortion. When the process servers met the steamer they were told that Dahl suddenly disappeared in mid-ocean, during a roaring storm on March 15.

Attorneys who said Dahl also was wanted in a civil suit were reported to have requested seizure of his effects. which were found in disorder in his cabin.


