At a meeting of the Executive Committee, October 19th, 1855, the following resolution was adopted:

"That in future all subscription lists received before the 31st March, in each year will appear in the next forthcoming report, while those received after that date shall be omitted."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, April 18th, 1856, it was directed:

"That if reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general purposes of the Society."

The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above resolutions.

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, in February, 1857, it was resolved:

"That in future but one Sermen be preached before the Society at its Annual Meetings, and that the sum of £5 be offered to the preacher toward defraying his travelling expenses."

In January last a Sub-Committee was appointed "to aid the Bishop in obtaining information respecting the endowments of Parishes and Missions, and the ability of the people to maintain their own missionary, with a view to an equalization of the aid which the Society may be able to afford."

This Sub-Committee prepared a tabular statement, shewing the available resources of each Parish and Mission and also stating the deficiency of salary in any case where the whole income fell short of what they were of opinion should be its minimum amount.

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, February 19th, 1858, it was "Resolved—That in future all applications for aid from this Society be proposed at one meeting and considered at the next."

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

THE Annual General Meeting of the Society was held in the National School at Halifax, on the 22d October, 1858.

The Right Reverend the President took the chair at half-past 1 o'clock. There was present a larger number of clergy and lay members of the Society than probably ever before attended its annual meeting.

After prayers by the Lord Bishop,
