

HIGH HONOR PAID TO AMBASSADOR

Body of Late Whitlaw Reid
Removed Under Military
Escort and Placed on
Board Cruiser Natal.

LONDON, Dec. 21.—The body of the late Ambassador Whitlaw Reid was started on its journey to the United States today and the highest military honors were paid to it as it left London.

The coffin was placed on a gun carriage drawn by six horses and driven by men of the Royal Horse Artillery. The Stars and Stripes was spread over the casket. Eight non-commissioned officers acting as bearers walked at each side.

As the procession started from Dorchester House on its way to Victoria Station it was led by a squadron of the Horse Guards in bright breast-plates, helmets with long plumes, and great scarlet cloaks enveloping horse and man. The band of the Scots Guards followed and behind them came the pipers of the regiment, who alternated with the other musicians in playing dirges. Then came the casket, which was followed by a battalion of Scots Guards, wearing their bearskin head dresses and carrying their rifles reversed.

At the same time a battery of horse artillery, stationed on the parade ground in St. James Park, fired a salute of 19 guns.

The route of the procession was kept clear by lines of mounted police. A guard of honor was drawn up inside Victoria Station and the men presented arms as the coffin was brought in and placed on the catafalque in the purple-draped car of the special train.

The band of the Scots Guards played "Auld With Me," and as the train drew out of the station the guard of honor presented arms and the pipers played "The Flowers of the Forest," a moving Highland dirge.

Full honors were paid to the body of the late Ambassador Reid on its arrival at Portsmouth.

Admiral Sir Hedworth Meux, the commander of the port, and the high naval officers stationed there, were present at the station when the train drew in. As it halted at the platform Nelson's flag, the Victory, fired a salute of 19 minute guns.

The coffin was borne across the jetty on the shoulders of eight petty officers of the British navy, and taken on board the armored cruiser Natal.

Funeral of Kitty Halted at Cemetery

Even The Body Was Encased in
Rosewood Officials Were
Not Moved.

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Dec. 21.—A funeral procession consisting of Mrs. Catherine Carter, a wealthy resident of Memphis, Tenn., and an undertaker and the body of her pet cat Tiger, was halted at the entrance to Pleasantville cemetery yesterday.

"You can't get a permit to bury that cat here," a group of cemetery officials announced.

Mrs. Carter was indignant. She pointed at the specially made casket containing her deceased pet of fifteen years. The coffin was of rosewood, trimmed with German silver, silk lined and perfumed and decorated with catnip, but the authorities were not moved.

Tiger was blind and had a broken back. He had been brought here for treatment by specialists, but died Tuesday of heart disease. Mrs. Carter had bought him a \$1000 diamond-studded collar.

Automobile Thieves Flourish in Gotham

Expert Mechanics Unlock Safety
Devices and Speed Into
Next State.

NEW YORK, Dec. 21.—It positively is not safe to leave an automobile unattended in the streets of New York, even under a locking device, according to Secretariat Edward S. Cornell of the National Highway Protective Society, who has recently been investigating the numerous thefts of automobiles. An organized gang of automobile thieves is at work, he declares, which the police are trying to run down.

The gang is said to include an expert mechanic, thoroughly acquainted with automobiles. It is upon this member that reliance is placed to unlock any device used by auto owners to safeguard their cars.

"It is a very simple matter for these thieves," said Secretariat Cornell. "The thieves change the number at once and as soon as possible they repaint the car. After that they speed into Pennsylvania and get a license for it there."
