AGAIN THAT "OATH" AND AGAIN REFUTED

Renfrew, Oct. 30, Nov. 30 - In refutation of an American publication that purported to "expose" the oath of the Knights of Columbus, the Renfrew Mercury, edited by W. E. Smallfield, mayor of the town and a Protestant, publishes the result of an investigation conducted by the editor and three other Protestant citizens, Jas. Mann, M. D., D. Barr, Sr., and G. G. McNeil. The investigation was made at the request of Rev. Father F. L. French, parish priest of Renfrew.

The commission finds that there is not a word of truth in the extravagant statements that were made regarding the oath. Some of the statements were most horrible.

On the contrary the commission concluded that the Knights of Columbus swear to "Wring no man, either in public or in private life," and to support the constitution of the country and that in the written and unwritten work there is not one word of hostility to non-Catholics or Masons.

Pamphlets containing the alleged "oath" of the Knights of Columbus were distributed at Shawville and other places. This is what caused the investigation.
