#### League to Free Abyssinian Slaves, Regardless of Wishes

Ras Tafari Will be Placed on the Carpet Next Month.

Geneva, Aug. 18.—(United Press)—The fifth assembly of the League of Nations which has been summoned for Sept. 1, will be called upon to decide to settle the problem of Abyssinia in virtually the only remaining civilized country in which it is known to exist.

The problem is all the more ticklish for the League, owing to the fact that Abyssinia is not only a member of the League, but she was admitted upon condition that she end at once the traffic of human beings in her territory.

In spite of this promise, reports coming to the League from both Abyssinia and neighboring countries indicate that she remains different of points of view on the Red Sea that endeavor to smuggle the slaves from Abyssinia across to Abba Minor where they are sold into the service of wealthy patrons.

While the League has every reason to believe that Ras Tafari, prince regent of Abyssinia, who is now touring the European capitals and who will attend personally the September assembly of the League of Nations assumes, in all sincerity, the obligation to break up slavery in his country, there remains differences of points of view on the question and also other aspects of the problem that are not all as easy to arrange.

#### What of Present Slaves?

In the first place, what Ras Tafari claims to be a descendant of King Solomon and the Queen of Sheba, pledged his country to stop the traffic in human beings, as far as the future is concerned, no specific arrangement was made for freeing those already in slavery, and to date Ras Tafari gives no indication of being inspired by the life of Abraham Lincoln.

What complicates the situation also is the fact that as far as can be ascertained these old slaves are not at all keen about being freed. They were captured in the open like wild animals, and in general, are well fed and treated. Their situation is declared to be entirely different from that of the American slaves who were taken from their native surroundings into a foreign country where climatic conditions and conditions of life are vastly different.

However, the League is acting on the mighty principle that slavery ought to be abolished and if the slaves of Abyssinia do not want to be freed so much the worse for them. The League feels that the interests of humanity are at stake and the principles at stake that they must be compelled to accept freedom.

In the second place, Ras Tafari insists that the Abyssinian brand of slavery is entirely different from that of the erstwhile American kind, for example, his government insists that the slaves are more in the position of medieval serfs than slaves; that they are attached to great properties or estates; that they are transferred along with the real estate but that they are not slaves in the ordinary sense of the word.
